








Financially Sustainable, Non-tax Burden, Public Open Space Providing Fresh Food

BAREC Provides Great Opportunities



- Vision for BAREC: Create a public open space that serves the community, grows local healthy food, and keeps the land in public space forever.
- Create a "Center of Excellence" in Urban Agriculture for Santa Clara County
- Bring agricultural education to children
- Sustainable local organic food systems which use less energy
- Start to localize food production
- Hands-on gardening, agriculture, and nutrition education, meeting State requirements and the new Wellness Program standards.

Fiscal Impact

Santa Clara City Council: Deny the application before you tonight

- Do not certify the EIR. There are too many problems not solved as seen in the five volume EIR and many community letters
- The majority of Santa Clara citizens do not support the current housing application.
- Put it on the ballot if you are unsure. A referendum cost everyone money.
- Do not change the zoning. If the zoning remains agriculture, the project gets denied.

Legislative Summit Results June 16, 2007

- Defer vote; take a six (6) month "time out"
- Create a task force to develop recommendations for BAREC
